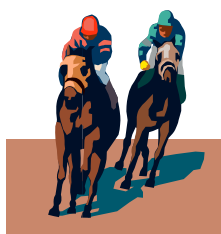

## KENTUCKY DERBY FACTS

- The youngest rider to ever win the Derby was Alonzo "Lonnie" Clayton, age 15 (1892)
- The first national television coverage of the Kentucky Derby took place in 1952
- The largest Derby crowd recorded was 163,628 people in 1974
- Over 80,000 mint juleps are sold at the track during Oaks & Derby
- A 2004 court order allowed jockeys to wear corporate advertising logos on their clothing
- There are 544 red roses in the winner's blanket
- In 2005, the Derby purse distribution was changed so that horses finishing fifth would receive a share



## THUNDER OVER LOUISVILLE

On April 27th, 2007, Louisville will kick off Derby festivities with a bang! Thunder Over Louisville, which has been recognized as one the Top 100 events and largest pyrotechnics display in North America, is guaranteed to be one of Louisville's most exciting days of the year. Over 800,000 people attended in 2006 and many more watched from home (this year will be the first Thunder Broadcast in HDTV). With crowds expected to surpass last year's numbers, it's time to make plans for watching this spectacular show. Check out some of these hotspots—many still
