TORNADO SEASON SAFETY

In the United States “tornado season” generally is in the spring from April through July, with May and June being the peak months. But, like thunderstorms, tornadoes can form any time of year, as most of us learned this February.

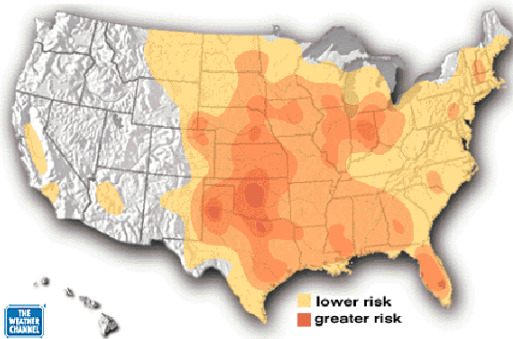
While tornadoes can still occur without a watch or warning being in effect, advances in science and technology have greatly increased the ability of

meteorologists to provide advance notice of them. When a tornado warning is issued, you may have very little time to prepare. It is important to not only know and understand the different types of tornado alerts, but also to have a tornado procedure in place for your home and workplace.

Two key alerts relate specifically to tornado conditions: tornado watches and tornado warnings. A tornado watch indicates that conditions are **conducive to the development of tornadoes** in and close to the watch area. A tornado warning indicates a tornado has actually been sighted by spotters or indicated by radar and **is occurring or imminent** in the warning area.

NATIONAL CITY TOWER TORNADO PROCEDURES

If a tornado warning is sounded, please follow these building procedures:

- Move away from the perimeter of the building and any part of your work area where there is glass.
- Go to the center corridor of the building and sit down.
- Do not get on the elevators. Stay where you are until the danger has passed.
- Do not leave the building or go to the lobby.
- In the event of a broadcast of a tornado warning in our immediate area, a warning will be announced on the public address system.
- After an “all clear” has been sounded, check for any possible injuries, and take appropriate action.
- Report any property damage which might present a danger.
